Astra Wins DLRSP Club Volunteer award 2013.





Astra HC had two nominations at last night Dún Laoghaire Rathdown Sport Partnership Volunteer Award 2013.

Andres Eiriksson was nominated for the award as long serving Coach.

Here the text of the award nomination:

It is difficult to list all Andres's achievements or quantify his contribution to the sport of Olympic

Handball in Ireland.

Andres has been volunteering as an Olympic handball coach for over 25 years, and through all these years he has given the most valuable contribution to the sport's development.

During these years Andres visited over 100 schools nationwide, including Northern Ireland introducing Olympic handball and delivering coaching courses. Andres is one of two Olympic handball qualified tutors for Olympic Handball in Ireland.

Over the past few years Andres has been working consistently in 6 schools delivering regular Olympic Handball training sessions.

The existence of Olympic Handball in Ireland can be seen as one of Andres's achievements as most of the people across the entire nation, that are today involved in handball at many levels, from administration to playing to coaching were introduced to the sport by Andres. Andres's contribution to the diffusion and development of handball is unquantifiable. Most of the handball clubs now in existence were started by people that were introduced to handball by Andres. Most of the players in the current Irish senior women team come from schools where Andres delivered coaching sessions and played in his club's teams. All the qualified Handball coaches come from the courses that Andres delivered through the years.

Andres worked silently for Olympic handball for over 25 years and in my opinion, he is the person that in the Irish Olympic handball environment most deserves a recognition award for his vital contribution.

Astra HC as a whole club won the Club Volunteer award.

Here the text of the award nomination:

Astra Handball Club is a rather young club born by the merging of two existing realities at senior and junior level.

The focus of the club is on the creation of a safe, healthy, and social environment for its members, in which to practice the sport they love.

AstraHC prioritises its member's enjoyment of the sport activities, and members' education. As today AstraHC is the only club in Ireland that encourages its coaches to further their education by supporting them in attending Coaching courses organised in Europe by the European Handball Federation. So far 4 AstraHC coaches over the past 3 years attended such courses, and the aim is to support a coach every year to attend such high profile seminars. Also, AstraHC coaches attended the Sport inclusion seminars and the code of ethics and good practice for Childers. Moreover in past few years AstraHC supported the qualification of 5 referees, and had members attending the Club administration Seminars.

AstraHC has a focus on women's handball and its women's section has suffered the smallest drop out of players compared to other handball clubs in Ireland, and AstraHC's senior women are now leading the Olympic Handball NGB task force for the development of women's handball. Astra Handball Club is a rather young club that since its creation has been focusing on the best practice in sport guidelines and the simple mission statement (PEOPLE EDUCATION PERFORMANCE). Astra HC puts its members first, starting with their love for sport and encouraging their continuous education and developed whatever their role within the club. The achievements outlined above show the result of this focus and Astra holds them high proudly.

AstraHC deserves this award as recognition to the work done and recognition of having focused its energy in the right direction: on people and their education. And as an encouragement to keep working within the guidelines of the best practice as primary driving force.
